Dear LRPC Commissioners and Lakes Region Legislators, Town Administrators/City Managers, Selectboards/City Councils, Planning Boards, and Interested Parties: On Monday, May 22, 2017 at the Winnepesaukee River Basin Program (WRBP) in Franklin, the Lakes Region Planning Commission will hold its regular commission meeting.

Our agenda will include a tour of the facilities and a presentation entitled “A Well-Kept Secret – the Winnepesaukee River Basin Program” - You’ll receive a basic overview of the program including: why it’s a regional resource, what’s new in the last several years and what’s being planned and why.

Sharon McMillin’s educational background includes a Bachelor of Science degree in Microbiology and a second Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematics. Both degrees were conferred concurrently from Texas A&M University. She received her Ph.D. in Biomedical Science, with a specialty in Cancer Genetics, from Eastern Virginia Medical School, which is affiliated with Old Dominion University in Norfolk, Virginia. She then pursued postdoctoral research at the Dana Farber Cancer Institute in Boston, which brought her to New England.

She has worked successfully as an environmental scientist managing environmental and industrial compliance laboratories, as the regional compliance manager for various industrial facilities across the Northeast, and as an environmental consult specializing in the design and operation of environmental remediation and wastewater treatment facilities as well as various other environmental projects primarily focused on soil and groundwater clean-ups and Environmental Health and Safety. She also holds wastewater treatment plant operators’ licenses in both NH and MA. On weekends and evenings, she was also an adjunct faculty member at the Nashua Community College for over 10 year - teaching basic and advanced science courses.

8 years ago, Sharon joined DES as the Winnepesaukee River Basin Program (WRBP or Program) Administrator. As Program Administrator and Acting Superintendent, Sharon is in overall charge of this regional wastewater system and its DES staff. Sharon is in charge of a staff of 20 located in Franklin and Laconia and a budget of \$6M+. Her role at the WRBP includes implementing necessary capital construction projects and facilitating improvements to the management, operation and maintenance of the Program – all to support a sustainable, compliant utility. She also serves as the DES liaison to the WRBP Advisory Board.

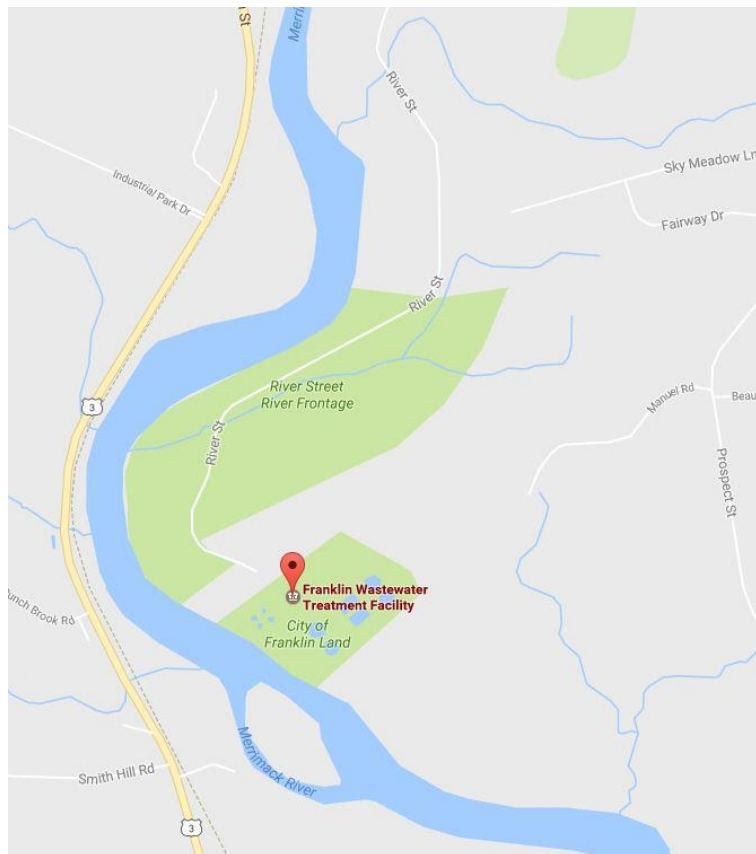
